

501(c)(3) Status

Hurra!

The Board of Directors is happy to announce the Petersburg Sons of Norway Hall has been Federally recognized as an official 501 c 3 nonprofit corporation! A small group of members have been working to gain this status as an ongoing attempt to put in place long range planning for the security and stability of maintaining our beloved Sons of Norway Hall Lodge building.

Sons of Norway International supported the move by local lodges to take official ownership of their respective properties and buildings by recusing all responsibility by the home office for physical facilities in locations scattered across the world. Our building is recognized as an Alaskan Historical Landmark so it only made sense to the Board to take the time to set up a separate organization to receive tax exemption benefits and tax-deductible contributions to support the ongoing maintenance of the facility. The Bojer Wikan Fishermen's Park and adjacent parking lot were also put under the auspice of the new corporation to secure tax benefits and make eligible for maintenance donations.

The membership structure of the new corporation gives all members in good standing with Sons of Norway International automatic membership in the local Petersburg Sons of Norway Hall corporation with the same Board of Directors leading the organization. The membership will continue to be notified per bylaws at regular meetings and/or through written communication as the Board takes action on issues and future planning.

The Board is excited about future challenges and wants you to know that your membership is more important now than ever! Donations will continue to be accepted by members and non-members alike and those donations are now tax exempt! Non-profit grant opportunities where membership numbers are noted will be a viable option as ongoing maintenance projects are recognized and planned for.

The Board thanks you for your loyal support during this process and is eager to share with you a bright future for the Petersburg Sons of Norway Hall!
